Inside Kyle's Head

The church season of Lent begins this month, on Ash Wednesday—a 40 day journey (not counting Sundays) to the Cross. Lent is everything that Advent was not: Serious instead of joyous, about giving things up rather than getting gifts, Jesus being executed rather than born. Advent and Christmas are easier than Lent and Easter because it's easier for us to focus on the joy of Jesus coming than it is on the parts of life that reminds us of why we need Jesus.

Yet Lent is a beautiful season as well. While Christmas draws a connection between birth and love, Lent and Easter help us ponder the connection between death and love. We don't truly understand how Jesus' death on the cross accomplished God's plan for humankind; there are more ways to explain it then there are headstones in any cemetery, all of which fall short of completeness. What we do know is this was God Become Human doing this willingly for us, in love for every single human being who ever lived, lives, and will live.

This Lent, let us focus and reflect on that truth: That God did this because God loves you, and God loves your neighbor who occasionally does something that annoys you, God loves politicians and CEOs, God loves the über-wealthy as well as the poor, God loves the addict who ODs and the family that addicts hurts over and over...and if the very worst person who ever lived was the only human being ever created, God would still make this sacrifice for them, in love.

What kinds of sacrifice can we make, in love, for God this Lent?

Recently you should have received a letter in the mail from Consistory asking you to update your information and status with the church. If you haven't done so already, I encourage you to take a few moments to do so today. For those of us who prefer pen-and-paper, there is a form with the letter you can fill out and get back to us in any number of ways. Or, you could do the quick and easy thing, if you haven't already.

In the letter you received and on the back of this issue of Visions there is a QR code—open the camera app on your smartphone or tablet, point it at the code and tap whatever pops up on screen. It will take you to the Google Form webpage of the survey. I promise you, it will take only 2-3 pain-free minutes to complete the form—I know, because I did it the other day.

So, don't stress out but, please, fill the form out one way or the other. It's simple, it's a great help for us all!

Ash Wednesday

The season of Lent, the 40 weekdays between Ash Wednesday and Easter, is a time given to spiritual reflection and exploration. In the early centuries of the church the observance was only a few days longs, but after the Council of Nicaea in 325 it was extended to forty days. That number mirrored the fasts of Moses, Elijah and Jesus. Observance was very strict. Only one meal a day was eaten. Meat, fish and eggs were forbidden. In modern times the emphasis on fasting has been reduced, but Lent is still a season given to greater prayer, contemplation and service. We'll observe the beginning of Lent with a worship service on Ash Wednesday, **February 22nd at 7pm** in the sanctuary.
