Inside Kyle's Head

Recently I attended a Black History Month celebration at which Kavonté Duckett, Frederick County council member from district 4, was introduced. He is the first Black person ever elected to County leadership (council or commissioners)! Also in attendance was a friend, Takesha Martinez, who a few weeks ago was appointed by Hagerstown City Council to be Mayor, the first Black person and only the second woman to serve in the role! (Hagerstown's previous mayor left for a position in the administration of Governor Wes Moore, the first Black person to serve as governor of our state.)

There was much rejoicing at these milestones in our community's and state's history, but also a recognition that it took far too long to reach this point, that there are far too few examples of Black people in leadership positions in our government, our schools, our communities. There are myriad reasons why, but now-former County Executive Jan Gardner and I had a chance last year to commiserate over one reason: Black, Latin, and other People of Color may move to our county and enter professions here, but they often don't stay and put down roots because they feel like they are, and always will be, treated as an outsider.

If there is any part of our community and county in a position to change that, it is the Church. God throughout the Old Testament repeats the instruction for us to "love the stranger", the outsider, for perhaps we know or remember what it is like to be the outsider. The writer of the epistle to the Hebrews suggests that we "show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." (Hebrews 13)

I would change one word there: we have an opportunity to embrace angels by being radically welcoming of the stranger, those who are new or different or otherwise unknown to us. This is what sets apart a church that is welcoming in a friendly sort of way to a church that is deeply welcoming of all people, no matter who they are or where they are on life's journey.

What might that look like for our church, in our community and county? What would it take for us to become educated in the culture and needs of people very different from ourselves? How would we change how we see and use the church facility? How would we offer other types or paths of faith and spiritual development?

I don't know what, exactly, that process of becoming involves or what it might end up as, but I think it is an interesting possible future. What do you think?






