



#### Inside Kyle's Head

Having new cats after a few years of living fur-free has been a time of adjustment, not the least of which is sleeping arrangements. Our previous two cats enjoyed sleeping on the bed near or up against us, but one of our new kittens, Fiona, wants to be under the covers.

Recently, I got up in the middle of the night, and when I came back to bed Fiona did her usual: came up to the top of the bed, between my pillow and Kathy's, and signaled she wanted under. Half-asleep, I obliged, and she proceeded to tunnel down beside my torso and then my legs, and curled up against my shins and feet. Soon I couldn't hear but I could definitely feel Fiona purring. I did nothing to prompt this; until that moment Fiona and Irazu (her brother) only purred when Kathy or I pet or brushed them.

The "awww" factor aside, purring actually has a physiological benefit: domestic cats' purrs are at a frequency that stimulates cell healing and growth. Not that cats only purr when they're feeling injured or sick, because anyone who's been around a cat long enough knows they more often purr because they are happy and content.

Fiona was purring not because of anything I had done, but simply because she was snuggled up against me and that made her happy. In the darkness I wondered: had I ever been this way toward God? Have I ever been happy just to be in God's presence, have I ever sought to be with God, even for a short time, as a beloved pet might do snuggled against us?

Anglican pastor Henry Martin painted Thomas' encounter with the risen Jesus in the image here. The expression on Thomas' face could not be more contented to be wrapped in the arms of God Become Human.

I invite you to join me in a post-Lenten discipline of thinking about and creating ways in our day to simply be in God's presence, to allow it to suffuse the space and time we are in at that moment, and to practice being content there. And may that time lead to a clarity of life where we begin to find, to make, peace in all spaces and live the "life more abundant" (John 10:10) that Jesus promises.

#### **Donations Needed**



Did you know that you can donate to the church while you are grocery shopping or eating out? With every gift card you purchase from the church







2023 Annua Easter Egg Hunt








#### Metal Recycling

Every Sunday from approximately 8:30am until 12:00pm in the Holy Family Catholic Community parking lot, Bill Traube and a core of volunteers collect any kind of metal, aluminum cans, steel, etc. All of the proceeds go to support 1) the local Middletown Ministerium Day of Service projects; and 2) local charities such as the Myersville Area Growing Project, Frederick Rescue Mission, Religious Coalition, Mission of Mercy, etc. In 2021, they donated over \$17K to these charities. #### DISASTER RELIEF FUNDRAISER






