Inside Kyle's Head

In worship the last Sunday of August, I shared with the students during our Blessing of the Backpacks that one of the greatest gifts of God is the question, "Why?" The question is a mark of the *imago dei*, what it means to say we are created in the image of God. We are able to see the world and ask why things are the way they are, to imagine a different world and to aspire to that world. We are able to imagine the realm of God.

"Why?" is also a prayer, as seen throughout the psalms. In Psalm 42, the psalmist cries, "Why are you downcast, O my soul?"; in Lamentations chapter five the writer pleads with God, "Why have you forgotten us completelv?"

"Why?" can also sometimes be our prayer: "why did I get cancer?", "why does racism persist in our society?", "why should I hope that

will ever change?" It's tempting to say it's only a prayer when we don't challenge God, but that's not being honest in our faith. The psalms of lament (of which 42 is a great example) challenge God, asking why in an expression of pain. The psalmist is blunt with God, not only expressing their "why?" but also asking something very specific from God in response. At the end, though, the psalmist affirms they trust God, remembering all the times God was faithful to them, and expressing praise to God.

A great example of this is found in the most well-known of the psalms. Though Psalm 23 is not one of the psalms of lament, the psalmist does express pain, and what lies beyond pain:

> Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and yours staff-

they comfort me.

Jesus himself cried the opening of Psalm 22 from the cross, "My God, my God—why have you forsaken me?" Here is a truth worth holding onto: The cry of God Become Human is our cry, the heart of God beats within our pain and suffering. *Emmanuel*, God With Us, has been truly with us...and if we dare to hold onto that, morning comes, and we see that God has been with us, protecting and comforting, and leading us onto new pathways of life.

School Food Donations




With school starting last month, we have resumed collecting items Middletown for the Backpack Program (a list

Through ur Wider Church Ministries, UCC has issued a special appeal to provide essential items and long-






