Consistory Communication

The Consistory members would like to thank the congregation for the attendance at and participation in the informational meeting on October $1^{\rm st}$. It is evident that, although we are experiencing a great deal of uncertainty and transition right now, this congregation is very much alive and looking to the future. Update on pulpit supply and pastoral care through December:

- ◆ Greg Shook will again be speaking on November 5th, 12th, and 19th. He has also expressed his willingness to help with pastoral care and visitation as needed during that time period. If you have or know of a need for pastoral care, please reach out to the church office at 301-371-6610 or to Laura Fontaine at 301-335-8058 so that we can make arrangements.
- ▶ Ed Higginbottom will be with us full-time beginning November 23rd through December 31st. Ed will hold office hours during the week and will fill the pulpit during the Advent season. More information about his office hours will be forthcoming. Please join us in expressing our gratitude for his service!

Consistory has met with Reverend Vertie Powers regarding possibilities for interim work after the first of the year. While Rev. Powers is unable to take on a full-time interim position, she does offer some suggestions for processing some of the trauma, transition, and uncertainty that we have been and are currently experiencing. She could dedicate a weekend each month for as long as we deem necessary to hold small group sessions (8-10 people/session, 2-3 hours/session) for discovery, visioning, processing on Saturday, then stay to preach for Sunday of that weekend. The other three weekends of each month would continue to be filled with church members or pulpit supply pastors. We have not made any decisions regarding moving forward with Rev. Powers, but wanted to present this option to you as a congregation to consider.

One of the requests from the congregation during the informational meeting in October was to have monthly congregational meetings to keep you informed of the work Consistory is doing. We will hold these meetings on the first Sunday of each month going forward during the Sunday School hour (starting at 9:15 a.m.). During the meeting on December 3, 2023, we would like to have your input regarding the possibility of hiring Rev. Powers on a consultant basis. Please plan to vote on that proposal during the December meeting.

Finally, it is time to begin assembling a search committee. If you feel called or would be willing to serve in this capacity, please contact Laura Fontaine at <code>laura.s.fontaine@gmail.com</code> or 301-335-8058. Our church profile was extensively updated after Mark Wakefield retired but will need to be reviewed and revised to suit our current situation. We have been made aware that the pool of ministers for the Catoctin Association (both intentional interims and settled pastors) is very limited, so this may be a long process to find the right person. We would like to get this committee identified and their work started by the end of November.

Mulling the Message

Sunday's preacher has a big edge over you. He, or she, reading, researching, musing and has spent hours preparing a message based on a passage of scripture. Then like a waiter presenting a filet-mignon this "Specialty of the House" is served on a platter for you to chew on. Here's a thought! What if you had read the scripture the day before and formed some of your own questions and connections; wouldn't you then be better able to engage, digest and even challenge the preacher's dish? Would you be a Candle Lighter?

During the four Sundays of Advent that precede Christmas you will see a wreath with five candles displayed on a stand in the chancel. There will one pink and three purple candles around a larger, central, white candle that represents the birth and arrival of Jesus. Our tradition is that the four colored candles are lit at the opening of worship by one of our church families. As they light that week's a short dedication is shared on the theme of LOVE (12/3), HOPE (12/10), JOY (12/17) and PEACE (12/24). If you would like to celebrate Advent in this way please contact Debbie, our church secretary and advise her whether you will write your own dedication or have one provided.

If you would like to donate a plant to decorate the sanctuary and receive the plant after the Christmas Eve Service, you can do so by using the enclosed order form or by contacting the church office. The poinsettias are provided by Dutch Plant Farm. The deadline to place your order is Friday, December 2nd.

Remembrance Sunday

All Saints Day is when, traditionally, people remember those who have gone before us into God's realm beyond our vision, and the place they still occupy in our hearts and minds. We will mark that on the first Sunday of November (November 5th), with Remembrance Sunday. During worship we will recall the names of members and friends of our church who died in the past year. We invite you to bring a picture of someone you want us to remember with you

that day—it doesn't matter how recently or long ago your person died. We will place the pictures on a table in front of the chancel to remind us to continue in and deepen our confidence in God's powerful presence in life and in death.

Ladies Chill night is on hiatus until after the holidays. They will resume gathering in January.



single event can alter many lives forever".










Children's Center Highlights


