Pastor's Pen

Dear Flock,

I write this as we are on the home stretch toward Christmas. I pray you have maintained sanity (mostly!) and are able to enjoy and process the significance of this season.

Rumor has it that, come January, we will be spending some time together. I am both excited and nervous (however, more excited). We have some work to do.

On our first Sunday together in the new year we will celebrate both Epiphany (which occurs January 6) and the Baptism of Our Lord (celebrated the first Sunday after the Epiphany). I do not want to give away my sermon, but I hope as many of you as possible will attend. Why?

Well, there are many reasons, but the main reason is that I can think of no better way to begin the new year than being together in worship. We will share in the Word, break bread together, and remember our baptisms and be "commissioned" as God's ambassadors to go into this crazy world.


The three seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany each bring a special message for us. Advent is a time of anticipation and preparing ourselves. Christmas is the celebration of God's gift, Jesus. Epiphany is when we celebrate the Light of Christ that hopefully inspires and leads us to new things. The Baptism of Jesus is where we experience Christ as both human and divine. So, what are we to do with all this, because this is a lot to process.

I am a fan of the British Comedy shows from the BBC. My all-time favorite is The Vicar of Dibley. It has a regular set of characters who are led by Geraldine, their first female vicar. The head of the parish council does his best to have her replaced but fails in each attempt. There is a regular core of characters who make up the parish council and, more or less, drive each other crazy. The show may seem far-fetched, maybe even a little irreverent at times. Nevertheless, it perfectly captures the church. Some of my mentors, Revs. Dean and Karen Miller, gave me the nickname "vicar." When Dean preached my ordination service, he spoke of this and spoke of the duties of a vicar, which include "leading a church through prayer, teaching, and worship, enabling God's people to be better disciples of Christ. Vicars are to preside at Holy Communion, baptisms, weddings, and funerals, and walk alongside people in their joy and in their grief."

Just like the people of the parish in Dibley, we come from all times, places, and bring ideas and desires. Sometimes our passions take over and we become a little headstrong. That is okay. It is okay because we are ALL God's children trying to do our level best. The thing that we must always remember is that, primarily, this is God's church. We must also remember that we should do our

best to function as a unit, to work TOGETHER to process what we need to be as a faith community, to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all we do, and to work toward results as one body. We are ALL ministers of the Gospel. I am merely a facilitator. As some of you know, my current ordination is in the Church of the Brethren. They have a motto or saying that "together we shall seek the mind of Christ." I love that. I think that as a church, this is the very thing that should keep us focused and working together to be all that we can be in a world that is hurting.



All of this has come unexpectedly for me. When I stood in your pulpit in July, I had no clue we would be working together on this level. Throughout my life, I have been nudged (sometimes dragged!) by the Holy Spirit. It has been a ride and a half, but always full of blessings along the way. The key is to fashion stepping -stones and not obstacles. Do you remember the poem I used in the first sermon? Just in case....

Princes & Kings: A poem by R. Lee Sharpe Isn't it strange how princes and kings, and clowns that caper in sawdust rings, and common people, like you and me, are builders for eternity?

Each is given a list of rules; a shapeless mass; a bag of tools. And each must fashion, ere life is flown, A stumbling block, or a Stepping-Stone."

I promise to do my best and expect you to do the same. Together, let us use the Gospel in new and exciting ways to inspire and provoke each other as well as the community outside the walls of our church.

Are you with me? We are in this together!

Soli Deo Gloria: To God alone be the glory!

Consistory Corner






