Dear Flock, Happy Easter!

It is interesting trying to write a newsletter article that can top the Resurrection of Jesus! I am being a little silly, however there is some truth to my opening line. How could we possibly top the miraculous events of Easter? Well, <u>let us</u> focus on Mary. Here's why.

You might find this difficult to grasp, but those of us who lead worship often find it difficult to feel "worshipful" or that we have had the worship experience we try so hard to bring to our congregations. <u>It is</u> tough and yet, I have experienced true worship in my time here with you. Why, here? Well, <u>it is</u> the sense and feeling of community.

Once Easter worship was over, I was sitting in the pastor's study thinking about the events of Holy Week. I recalled a conversation about 30 years ago with someone who, right after Easter worship, asked me, "Do you really believe in the doctrine of resurrection?" I told him he had asked the wrong question. Looking puzzled he asked me why.

You can believe something without it ever affecting you. You can believe that <u>brussel</u> sprouts or tofu is good for you without ever trying it. You can believe that your favorite team will be successful without ever going to a game. The thing about Easter is that it is not about the third person confession, but a first-person experience. I have always felt that Mary Magdalene's declaration of "I have seen the Lord" has always been more powerful, more meaningful, more significant than the traditional "He is risen. He is risen indeed!"

And if you are ever in a difficult <u>situation or</u> have doubts about the significance of the Lenten/Holy Week/Easter experience or the presence of Christ in our world ... well, remember that "I have seen the Lord," because we have. Even if we do not always recognize it, we have. Really? How? Where?

Well, this is powerful stuff. <u>It is</u> a statement that says, "Yes, there is still good, and beauty, and love in the world." "I have seen the Lord" is a proclamation and declaration that evil and death will never, ever get the last final word!

I pray you all have an Easter experience where you can encounter the risen Lord. Sometimes we have to really look, but it's there.

Just remember Mary's words, "I have seen the Lord!"

Consistory Corner

It's hard to believe it's April already, it seems like the year has just begun and we're already in the second quarter. There has been a lot going on at Christ Reformed in the first three months of the year as part of the search for a settled pastor. We held three workshops with consultant Reverend Dr. Vertie Powers. She helped the congregation focus on the issues related to this time of transition at the church. At the second workshop we focused on the need for new Vision/Mission statement, we began developing a plan for activities for children at the church, and looking at ways to make the church building more inviting, accessible and welcoming. In the third meeting with Reverend Powers we discussed, among other things, what we are looking for in a settled pastor. Most of you are already aware that Reverend Powers will not be able to continue as a consultant to Christ Reformed due to family issues. However we developed many ideas that we can discuss these further at upcoming monthly congregational information meetings.

These informational meetings also provide an opportunity for members of the congregation to raise questions for the Consistory, or to raise issues that congregation members feel Consistory should focus on. The next congregational informational meeting is this Sunday morning, April 7, between the two services.

By-laws Revised

In other Consistory related news, we have been working on revising and updating the church bylaws. The committee charged with revising the bylaws has submitted a draft to the full consistory for review. Once their comments have been incorporated into the by-laws and they have been approved by Consistory, the revised by-laws will be made available to the congregation for review, discussion and approval. It is expected that the vote will take place in late summer or early fall.

Book Club

The Book Club will meet at noon on Tuesday, April 23, at Fratelli's to discuss <u>The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store</u> by James McBride. Our story opens with the discovery of a skeleton in a well and flashes back to explore its connection to a town's Black, Jewish and immigrant history.

Sub & Soup Sale

The Growing Hope Globally Growing Project, which includes nine churches in the community that raise money to fight world hunger, is hosting a sub and soup sale. There are foot long subs, country ham sandwiches, turkey and provolone sandwiches, and

chicken noodle soup available for purchase. Orders are due by April 19th. Orders can be picked up on Saturday, April 27th from 11am to Noon or after church on Sunday, April 28th. Order forms are available in the Narthex or you can call Linda DeLauder at 240-490-5880 to place your order.








WEEKEND FOOD PROGRAM

Many children in the Middletown valley area are provided a free or reduced priced lunch on school days, but they face the prospect of hunger on the weekend. In partnership with area churches, the weekend food program helps to fill this gap by providing weekend bags full of food for over 102 children in these eight schools: Middletown Elementary, Primary, Middle and High School, Myersville, Valley and Wolfsville Elementary.

How Can YOU Help These Children?

- ◆ YOU can SPONSOR a child for a year at a cost of \$300.00, in whole or in part - simply make out your check to CRUCC and indicate on the memo line that it is for the Weekend Food Program.
- ◆ YOU can PURCHASE the specific foods needed and put the items in the designated box located in the Narthex
- ◆ YOU can VOLUNTEER your time to pack the food.
- YOU can DELIVER the food to a school.





Metal Recycling

Every Sunday from approximately 8:30am until 12:00pm in the Holy Family Catholic Community parking lot, Bill Traube and a core of volunteers collect any kind of metal, aluminum cans, steel, etc. All of the proceeds go to support 1) the local Middletown Ministerium Day of Service projects; and 2) local charities such as the Myersville Area Growing Project, Frederick Rescue Mission, Religious Coalition, Mission of Mercy, etc. In 2023, they donated over \$24K to these charities. All are encouraged to bring their scrap metal for a good cause. Small items can be left on the back porch of the Parish House.
