Dear Flock,

I love Spring. The darkness, baron lands, and trees re-emerge from their rest and come to life in a palette of golds and greens. To me, Spring restores my faith in renewal and rebirth and gives way to the bright sunny days of Summer. Spring also brings us the promise and hope of Easter, which takes us through the darkness of Lent into the warmth, sunshine, and promise of the Easter message. It's all about renewal, regenerating, and moving forward.

As Spring unfolds, I can't make the drive to the Middletown Valley without remembering the words from Song of Solomon 2:11-13. ¹¹ for now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. ¹² The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land. ¹³ The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines are in blossom; they give forth fragrance. Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away.

Judy Collins is one of my favorite songwriters. Her career has been amazing and she has proven herself as a wonder musician and lyricist. One of my favorites of her efforts is a song called *The Fallow Way*. It is a song she composed while out for a morning walk in the Spring of 1997. Judy says this about transitions:

Wintertime comes what may. In wilder places, when winter comes and everything shuts down, we really do learn something. The problem is that for many people in many ways, winter doesn't matter anymore. We can have peaches in the middle of winter. We can have heat and light, and not have to cooperate and hunker down. But in the long run, we should take a message from nature, obey it, and listen to what it's talking to us about. To do that takes discipline and it takes a space – the kinds of things that most people have a hard time coming up with.

Transitions take time. We want to go "full steam ahead" and make things happen. It doesn't work that way. Transitions take time. It is a slow process. Time is time and to do things well and be our best, we don't need to hurry. As a church, we are transitioning and unfolding, yet again. Yes, the winters have been with us, but there is an unfolding in store for us, just as Mother Nature has an unfolding in store for the earth. Yes, it will take work and time. However, let us embrace this time together with love, patience, dreams, open minds, and excitement. Thanks be to God!

There will be a Congregational meeting on May 19, 2024 at 9:15am in the Chapel. The primary purpose of the meeting is to get a report from the Weagly House Committee with their recommendations on the future of the property. FOOD PROGRAM

Many children in the Middletown valley area are provided a free or reduced priced lunch on school days, but they face the prospect of hunger on the weekend. In partnership with area churches, the weekend food program helps to fill this gap by providing weekend bags full of food for over 102 children in these eight schools: Middletown Elementary, Primary, Middle and High School, Myersville, Valley and Wolfsville Elementary.
