

## Pastor's Pen

Dear Flock,

As we wind down our summer, we look toward Fall, the splendor of color, and new beginnings in our lives and for our church. The first thing to highlight is Heritage Sunday on September 22 and then celebrating Middletown Heritage Days the next weekend.

The definition of heritage from The United Nations Education, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) tells us that "Heritage is our legacy from the past, what we live with today, and what we pass on to future generations. Our cultural and natural heritage are irreplaceable life and inspiration sources."

What does this mean for us in the church? Well, here is the time to relive the past! Here is the time to remember the faithful who built our church, sustained it for many years, and give it hope for the future. I'm sure each person in this congregation has their brightest heritage memories of the church.

Our heritage is important because our very identities are shaped by it, and our heritage connects the past, present, and future and provides clues for people and cultures to see what worked, what didn't, and how to continue without making the same mistakes. #### 2024 Neighbors In Need

On the first Sunday in October we'll join with other UCC churches around the country to support the Neighbors in Need (NIN) offering. This is a special offering of our denomination that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. To contribute you can write a check to the church and note it "NIN" or pay online using Realm, our online giving platform.

#### Heritage Sunday Celebration




- 1. <u>The Bounce House</u>-We need 4 or 5 volunteers to monitor the bounce house.

# OOD PROGRA


Many children in the Middletown valley area are provided a free or reduced priced lunch on school days, but they face the prospect of hunger on the weekend. In partnership with area churches, the weekend food program helps to fill this gap by providing weekend bags full of food for children in these area schools: *Middletown Elementary*, *Primary, Middle and High School, Myersville, Valley and Wolfsville Elementary*.

## How Can YOU Help These Children?

- YOU can SPONSOR a child for a year at a cost of \$300.00, in whole or in part – simply make out your check to CRUCC and indicate on the memo line that it is for the Weekend Food Program.
- YOU can PURCHASE the specific foods needed and put the items in the designated box located in the Narthex
