

PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Flock,

I am blessed with many wonderful friends and colleagues from my career as a musician and my time in the church as a musician and pastor. There are people from all over the globe who have crossed my path and left me changed in one way or many! I am grateful for our associations, whether brief or ongoing.

One person, Chris, retired from being an elementary/middle school librarian. He talks about spending years in the printed world and how there were times early in his career when he would read many of the books in the libraries that he oversaw. He would imagine becoming the main character in the stories. Over the years as things became busier, that close association with books waned as administrative duties became more involved. He said that things sort of stayed that way until one evening he was reshelving books and saw several books that piqued his interest. He ended up checking out the books, reading them, and again allowing his imagination to place him in each of the stories.

I received a weekly meditation from several writers, and one from last week talked about using our imagination to deepen our relationship with God. She shared how she read one of her daughter's library books from school. Her daughter had checked out Ann Rinaldi's book, Wolf by the Ears, a story about a slave girl who belonged to Thomas Jefferson. She said that, like my friend Chris, she put herself into the role of the main character. She said, "Her actions were my actions. Her thoughts were my thoughts. I used my imagination to more fully enter into her experience. History became real to me!"

My thoughts immediately turned toward the winding down of Lent and the upcoming events of Holy Week. We've heard the scriptures, told the stories, and been through the busyness of Holy Week. How about THIS year, we become a part of the story? Put yourself in the main character role or find a character from the various stories and "become" that person this year. Absorb yourself in the story, using your creative imagination to bring the stories to life. Find that quiet time we talked about in last week's sermon to absorb the story as one of the characters. Come join us as we worship together, finding a more meaningful Lenten and Easter experience living with and in God's word.

Wishing you all a meaningful remainder of Lent and the upcoming events of Holy Week and Easter.


Walking the Labyrinth






Big Thank You to the members of the Eastern Gas and Transmission Community

furniture left from the former tenets.
















WEEKEND FOOD PROGRAM

Many children in the Middletown valley area are provided a free or reduced priced lunch on school days, but they face the prospect of hunger on the weekend. In partnership with area churches, the weekend food program helps to fill this gap by providing weekend bags full of food for children in these schools: *Middletown Elementary, Primary, Middle and High School, Myersville, Valley and Wolfsville Elementary.*

How Can YOU Help These Children?

- SPONSOR a child for a year at a cost of \$300.00, in whole or in part simply make out your check to CRUCC and indicate on the memo line that it is for the Weekend Food Program.
- PURCHASE the specific foods needed and put the items in the designated box located in the Narthex
- VOLUNTEER your time to pack the food.





You are invited to use it as an aid in journeying into the mystery of Christ's death. From 6:00 to 7:30pm the church will be open for quiet prayer, communion, and private prayer. No service. Just come and stay as long as you like.

Sunday, April 20th Easter Sunday 6:30am & 10:00am

We'll celebrate Christ's resurrection at two services of worship. We'll gather at 6:30am for sunrise from the gazebo located in the cemetery. Following the service the Parish Life Board will host a continental breakfast in the Coffee Hour Space. We'll then celebrate with communion at our combined worship in the Sanctuary at 10:00am.
