#### PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Flock,

Yesterday we sang one of, if not *the* favorite hymn of mine. It was sung at my first ordination and it just embodies the mission that we, the church, must embrace. It should be our rally cry, our song to march into whatever "battle" we are facing at the time. Why is this song so important? How does it apply to us?

Well, here's the text:.

- 1 The church of Christ in ev'ry age, beset by change but Spirit-led, must claim and test its heritage and keep on rising from the dead.
- 2 Across the world, across the street, the victims of injustice cry for shelter and for bread to eat, and never live before they die.
- 3 Then let the servant church arise, a caring church that longs to be a partner in Christ's sacrifice, and clothed in Christ's humanity.

- 4 For Christ alone, whose blood was shed, can cure the fever in our blood, and teach us how to share our bread and feed the starving multitude.
  - 5 We have no mission but to serve in full obedience to our Lord; to care for all, without reserve, and spread his liberating word.

Text: Fred Pratt Green, 1969

What do you see and take away from this text? Does it rally you to be God's advocate in the world? Does it motivate you to be God's purveyor of justice in our world that still discriminates and does not seek or offer justice to all of God's children?

English hymnwriter Fred Pratt Green was asked by the editors of *Hymns and Songs* to write a hymn that "tackled the relationship between Sabbath and Sunday. So far it has made it's way into many hymnals. The most popular tune used with this hymn is the tune is WAREHAM (1738) by William Knapp.

Many years back, when I was in the early discernment stages of wrestling with this nudge to be involved in church leadership, I was sent to speak and do an interview with John Williams, then District Superintendent for the Cumerland/Hagerstown District of the United Methodist Church. John knew that I was "resisiting" the call to become more pastoral and so we kind of interviewed each other. I asked him what inspired him the most in his pastoral leadership. He said the thing that has kept him focused throughout his ministry was that through the ages, the church has prevailed. It hasn't been perfect. It has weathered all sorts of political movements, undergone change after change, witnessed injustices locally and worldwide, and still prevails. I could not stop thinking about his words for weeks. He then referred me to this hymn text.

Think about just in your lifetime what you have seen in our world and how the church has managed to serve, remain strong, and ready itself for the next task. This hymn calls out the church to be the agent of change and reconciliation in the struggle against injustice and hunger, both physically and spiritually.







